Objectives:

NATIONAL WORKSHOP FOR HIGH COURT JUSTICES ON DIRECT TAXES

Objectives:

Tax administration has been a matter of concern in many quarters both domestically and overseas. This eventually, places a greater burden on the judiciary as a final arbiter between the state and the taxpayer. To develop expertise on disputes in this area, the workshop is conceived to facilitate deliberation among participant justices on contemporary issues and recent developments in direct taxation in India and globally. It will provide a forum for discussing normative issues pertaining to the history and basic features of tax laws along with constitutional provisions for the finance bills; international tax treaty law and double tax avoidance agreements; transfer pricing; and appellate and writ jurisdictions of High Courts. Deliberations would be primarily based on case studies and analysis of relevant judgments.

Cyber Laws & Appreciation of Digital Evidence & Special Programme (e-Committee)

Objectives:

The one-day special program in collaboration with the e-committee of the Supreme Court of India is for the participating High Court Justices. The program aims to sensitize and enable the High Court Justices to the novelties, & the ephemeral nature of the scope and dynamics of cyber threats. The program shall also offer a platform to understand the law and procedures relating to appreciation of electronic evidence, considering the increasing role of such digital evidence impacting litigation and challenging constitutional rights. The program shall attempt to examine the effectiveness and efficacy of the extant policies, judicial knowledge, infrastructure and capability to deal with the fast mutating forms of digital evidences. The seminar will focus on the need for a contemporary judge to acquaint with the cross-disciplinary knowledge of technology and law.

Objectives:

The Orientation Course for Newly Elevated High Court Justices is designed to provide a forum for participant justices to deliberate upon contemporary issues and developments in the writ jurisdiction of the High Court under Art. 226 of the Constitution and its application in the dynamic and constantly changing social paradigms. Some core areas that will be focussed upon during the course include the scope of judicial review of legislative and administrative actions, principles of judicial review & proportionality and the extent of judicial review viz. judicial restraint and activism. 




