
# Access to Justice & Access to Court


Timely delivery of justice is a part of human rights. Denial of speedy justice is a threat to public confidence in the administration of justice.





: Ganga Devi was always a fighter. So when the district magistrate served a property attachment notice on her after a dispute in 1975, she protested vehemently. Then 37, she challenged the action before the civil judge and won the case two years later in 1977.

Fate though had another, harder battle in store for her. During the course of the trial, the judge had asked Ganga to pay a court fee of Rs 312, which she did. But just as she was ready to get the final copy of the order that was in her favour, someone noticed that Ganga hadn't attached a receipt of the Rs 312 that she had already shelled out. 
## Who is responsible for Delays?

Indian Judicial System Pendency of Cases – Who is Responsible?








Released by the World Bank, the report states that the introduction of the Grid "made it possible to generate case management reports on local courts, thereby making it easier to enforce contracts".

#### Supreme Court Vidhik Anuvaad Software (SUVAS)

The Constitution Day function was also marked by the unveiling of the Supreme Court's official mobile application and the machine-assisted translation tool that employs Artificial Intelligence, 'Supreme Court Vidhik Anuvaad Software' or SUVAS for facilitating translation of judicial documents in eight languages.

The mobile app was developed with the technical consultation of the National Informatics Centre. The app will provide "authentic real time" access and updates with regard to *Case Status, Display Board, Daily Orders, Judgments, Office Reports, Circulars and other useful information for* lawyers and litigants. The app will be made available for download from the official website of the Supreme Court. It will be available in English, Hindi and six other regional languages.

The unveiling of these new services took place after the inaugural address by President Kovind.

In his address, President Kovind encouraged lawyers to take up pro bono cases, and "to distribute the fruits of knowledge to the needy." While addressing the issue of accessibility of justice by all, he stated that it has to be a "collective effort of all the stakeholders, the Bench and the Bar".

# CASE MANAGEMENT:

Case Management is comprehensive system of management of time and events in a law suit as it proceeds through the justice system from start to end.

#### Ramrameshwari Devi v. Nirmala Devi, (2011) 8 SCC 249

Steps laid down for trial courts for improving the existing system:

- Court should scrutinise, check and verify pleadings and documents filed by the parties immediately after filing of plaint

-It should prepare a complete schedule and fix dates for all stages of the suit at time of filing of plaint

-It should impose actual and realistic costs on wrongdoers, grant mesne profits at market rate to affected party and also order prosecution of wrongdoer for perjury in appropriate cases


